NEWS

- **HEA Principal Fellow application success.** Congratulations to CAIPE Board member Dr Maggie Hutchings on being awarded a Principal Fellowship of the Higher Education Academy (HEA). Dr Maggie Hutchings is Associate Professor and Academic Lead Education Development at Bournemouth University. A Principal Fellowship of the HEA is awarded to professionals who demonstrate a sustained record of effective strategic leadership in academic practice and academic development as a key contribution to high quality student learning.
- **HCPC Standards of conduct, performance and ethics - Public Consultation.** In June 2015 CAIPE responded to the Health and Social Care Professions Council (HCPC) consultation on revised standards of conduct, performance and ethics. These are the high level ethical standards that the HCPC set for all the professionals they register. They set out in broad terms the behaviour expected of registrants. The HCPC reviewed the existing standards to make sure that they continued to be fit for purpose, up-to-date and well understood by registrants and the public.
