- **'Francis Effect' on NHS care one year on from Mid Staffs Inquiry with 2,400 more nurses hired in the last year.** Figures show that NHS care has changed for the better just one year on from the Francis Inquiry into Mid Staffordshire, Health Secretary Jeremy Hunt said at a conference in London. He spoke about the 'Francis Effect', with improvements including failing hospitals being put on the road to recovery, more nurses on the wards, more doctors, and feedback direct from patients changing the way hospitals work.
