- **New CAIPE Membership Fees for 2014.** In view of the increased costs from Informa for providing the Journal of Interprofessional Care and the increased costs of CAIPE overheads, the CAIPE Board, regrettably, has deemed it necessary to increase membership fees. Mindful of the present economic climate, and after careful consideration the Board has agreed that the membership fees for 2014 onwards should be increased by the minimum amount required to cover CAIPE's increased costs, but still offer excellent value. - **Oxleas NHS Foundation Trust uses the EBCD Toolkit to improve mental health services.** The experience-based co-design (EBCD) toolkit is a distinctive approach, which captures the experiences of patients, carers and staff through discussion, observation and filmed interviews; then brings them together to explore findings and to work in small groups to feed this into service improvement. Oxleas NHS Foundation Trust used the toolkit but with additional support through its ResearchNet group, where service users, carers and providers work collaboratively to improve services. The result of the EBCD work was striking in terms of assessing patient experience and provided information impossible to get any other way. - **A Research study to look at how diagnostic assessment programs be implemented to enhance inter-professional collaborative care for cancer.** Inter-professional collaborative care (ICC) for cancer leads to multiple system, organizational, professional, and patient benefits, but is limited by numerous challenges. Empirical research on interventions that promote or enable ICC is sparse so guidance on how to achieve ICC is lacking. Research shows that ICC for diagnosis could be improved. Diagnostic assessment programs (DAPs) appear to be a promising model for enabling ICC. - **ResearchNet** is a network of service user and carer volunteers and staff members who work collaboratively with Oxleas NHS Foundation Trust and wider groups, to develop mental health services and improve patient experience through structured volunteering and training. Research doesn't just mean sitting in front of a computer. ResearchNet volunteers take part in all aspects of research. They: **Critically appraise** the knowledge that already exists about mental health, **Consult** on, and take an active role in, all aspects of research design, implementation and analysis, **Plan** activities and events together and receive training, **Interview** service users, carers and staff, **Present our results** at conferences, to mental health teams, trainees and in publications, **Provide feedback and work with** staff on improving services for service users and carers, **Link** in with other service user and carer research networks nationally. - **Experience-based co-design toolkit - Working with patients to improve health care.** This toolkit outlines a powerful and proven way of improving patients' experience of services, and helps you to understand how it can help you meet your aims. A 2013 global survey discovered that EBCD projects had either been implemented, or were being planned in more than 60 health care organisations, in countries including Australia, Canada, England, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Sweden, and the United States. As well as step-by-step guidance, the toolkit includes videos of people who have taken part in EBCD projects. These help bring to life the successes and range of benefits that can result from implementing this type of improvement project. The toolkit also includes downloadable resources such as template forms, letters, presentations and other materials, to help you plan and carry out this approach. This latest version of the toolkit was produced in 2013. It incorporates learning and feedback from staff and patients involved in more than 60 EBCD projects, including an important adaptation, the accelerated form of EBCD.
