- **Closure of the General Social Care Council (GSCC)** On 31 July 2012 the GSCC will close, bringing to an end a very important chapter in the history of social work. From 1 August 2012 the Health and Care Professions Council (HCPC) (currently the Health Professions Council (HPC)) will be the new regulator for social workers and social work education in England. - **New name for the Health Professions Council** On Wednesday 1 August 2012 The Health Professions Council will change its name to the Health and Care Professions Council. At the same time, it will also become the statutory regulator of social workers in England, taking over regulatory responsibilities from the General Social Care Council. This excellent news of the higher IF is of particular importance to those researchers in academia where staff are encouraged to only submit papers to journals with good impact factors.
