- **Heart failure management programs that seem to be the most successful are those that involve pharmacists as integral members of a multidisciplinary health care team.** A recent study is the latest addition to a growing body of research indicating that pharmacists working under collaborative drug therapy management (CDTM) arrangements can provide invaluable clinical care for patients with heart failure (HF). The findings showed that pharmacist services provided under a CDTM arrangement, including interventions such as initiation, discontinuation and titration of HF drugs, was associated with 30-day readmission rates as low as 3.4% compared with the national average of 24% to 30%.
