NEWS

- **New CAIPE Chair elect** The CAIPE board is delighted to inform members that the next chair of CAIPE will be Dr Richard Gray; he will take up his post as CAIPE chair at the AGM June 20th 2013. - **Individual and corporate members renewal** Membership is due for renewal on 1st January 2013 onwards. Please do not renew before this date, as registration begins on the 1st January 2013.
- **Corporate Forum meeting in October.** Edinburgh Napier University and Robert Gordon University co-hosted the Corporate Forum meeting in October at Edinburgh Napier University. Over 20 people attended representing 9 corporate members and the CAIPE Board. 6 presentations from Glasgow Caledonian University, Queen Margaret University, the Universities of Dundee and St Andrews, Edinburgh Napier University and Robert Gordon and Aberdeen Universities showcased IPE development in Scotland.

There was very lively and informative discussion about peer assessment, the role of administrators in IPE and the challenges of delivering courses designed by others, and how to get commitment, research into the relationship between academic confidence and engagement in IPE, different types of clinical attachment and placements, the challenge in providing interprofessional learning for students in single profession HEIs and management issues and interprofessional on-line learning, for example how to allocate time for staff to monitor online discussion, whether the principle of virtual group learning were the same as for face to face groups, and the need to staff to be proactive in forums. The forum concluded with plans for the return of the Scottish Interprofessional Special Interest Group. The full report and presentations will be available on the website shortly.

- **Brief summary of Chair's Event** The 2012 CAIPE Chair's Event was held on 23rd November at the NCVO in London. The excellent keynote presentations [Jane Morris, Chair of NAEP; Susie McDonald, Director of Tender] were varied and informative allowing the audience to focus on both the importance of education in practice and on domestic abuse in the community. The five "transitionees" [Rachel Bellenger, Celia Chambers, Alifa Isaacs-Itua, Lynn Green, and Fiona Frame] who presented their own person stories of transition from student to practitioner were also very informative and entertaining whilst being from a variety of perspectives. Audience participation during the breakout session and the open discussion explored both good, not so good aspects of the transition and how things could possibly be improved.

This, the third Chair's Event, was once again very well received by those present and we can look forward to addressing another issue of importance in 2013. <http://www.caipe.org.uk/resources/chairs-event/>

- **AAMC Receives Grant to Develop Portal for IPECT** The Association of American Medical Colleges, as a partner in the Interprofessional Education Collaborative (IPEC), has been awarded funding by the Macy Foundation to launch an interprofessional education portal in support of the IPEC report "Core Competencies for Interprofessional Collaborative Practice." The initiative will create a national clearinghouse of competency-linked learning resources on interprofessional education and models of team-based or collaborative care. - **Higher Education Academy (HEA) announces a newly named cluster- Health and Social Care.** The new name, for the former Health Sciences cluster, reflects the inclusion of Social Work and Social Policy disciplines which were previously part of the Social Sciences group.
