- **John Horder Award 2014.** The first John Horder Award was presented on 18/9/14 at the Royal Society of Medicine. The winning team, whom the judges felt demonstrated the very best attributes of interprofessional learning and working, was the South Lambeth Road Practice, London. The presentation, based on their successful submission was given by two general practitioners from the team: Dr Imtiaz Ahmad and Dr Nicola Gehlhaar. The presentation title was "Adolescent health: interprofessional training in general practice." The award of £1500, donated jointly by CAIPE and the General Practice with Primary Health Care Section of the RSM, was presented by Dr Elizabeth Horder and will be used by the team to develop their initiative.

The programme provided the representatives of universities and LETB's from around the country with a most stimulating day.
